**London:** The UK may cut taxes on inheritance when it unveils its latest budget next week, The Telegraph newspaper reported, as the government tries to support a slowing economy without reigniting inflationary pressures. A reduction in the country's inheritance tax was possible, the newspaper said, along with an extension of the "full expensing" benefit for companies' investments announced in the last budget in March. Also under consideration for next week's Autumn Statement was a cut to stamp duty, it added, without giving additional details. Bloomberg

"Of those approved companies, 21 companies are ready to start their manufacturing on Day Zero while the other four will start production within the next 90 days," Vaishnav said.

The government expects that these companies will generate a total of 30,000 direct jobs and 100,000 indirect jobs.

The second phase of the PLI scheme for IT hardware was notified in May this year. It had a budgetary outlay of ₹17,000 crore, which was more than double the incentives offered by the ministry of electronics and information technology in the first phase of the scheme.

The first phase had, however, failed to attract enough applications, and was given a miss by major companies. Till June 2022, the total investments under the first phase of the scheme were only around ₹200 crore as against estimated investments of more than ₹2000 crore. Subsequently, it was done away with and a second phase of the PLI scheme was introduced with better sops and an improved incentive structure for applicants. This attracted proposals from about 50 Indian and foreign IT hardware manufacturing companies.

In August, the government and the proposals received had laid out plans for incremental investments of more than ₹5,000 crore, with an additional production value expected to be ₹450 lakh crore over the next six years.

Global IT hardware giants such as Dell and HP applied directly under the scheme, while others such as Lenova had applied for the scheme through their respective LSS (electronic manufacturing service) companies such as Electronics and Rising Star, a subsidiary of Taiwan's Foxconn.

Indian companies such as Pidilite (Dow), VVNR Networks, Syntex, Optemus, Sabreca, Neolytic, Panache, Solo (Lava) and Keyence Tech had also applied.

The companies which have not applied yet under the revised scheme are also evaluating their proposals, according to Vaishnav who said it is just a matter of time before these companies also set up shop in India.

"We have very objective evaluation mechanism. And the companies which have been evaluated and passed the rigor that is required, only those have been approved. Many of the companies already have their investments in India. So, this will be the last major investment," Vaishnav said.

## Israeli Air Strikes Kill 32 in Gaza Amid Calls for Civilians to Flee

Israel warns civilians in south Gaza to relocate as it turns to attack Hamas in the enclave's south

**Gaza / Jerusalem:** Israeli air strikes on residential blocks in south Gaza killed at least 32 Palestinians on Saturday, medics said, after Israel again warned civilians to relocate as it turns to attacking Hamas in the enclave's south after launching the strike.

Such a move could compel hundreds of thousands of Palestinians who fled south from the Israeli assault on Gaza City to move again, along with residents of Khan Younis, a city of more than 40,000, fearing a dire humanitarian crisis. "We're asking people to relocate. I know it's not easy for many of them, but we don't want to see civilians caught up in the conflict," Mark Regev, an aide to Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, told MSNBC on Friday.

Israel vowed to annihilate the Hamas militant group that controls the Gaza Strip after its Oct. 7 rampage into Israel in which its fighters killed 120 people and dragged 200 hostages into the enclave, according to Israeli officials.

Since then, Israel has bombed much of Gaza City - the enclave's urban core - to rubble, ordered the

Gaza health authorities raised the death toll on Friday to more than 12,000, 3,000 of them children. The United Nations deems those figures credible, though they are now updated infrequently due to the difficulty of collecting information.

Overnight on Saturday, 20 Palestinians were killed and 23 injured by an air strike on two apartments in a multi-story block in a busy resi-

dential district of Khan Younis, according to health officials.

Eyad Al-Zezni told Reuters he lost his aunt, her children and her grandchildren in the air strike in Khan Younis, and that all had evacuated from north Gaza as Israeli army orders only to do where the army told them they could be safe.

"All of them were martyred. They had nothing to do with the (Hamas) resistance," said Zeezn, standing outside the morgue at Nasser Hospital in Khan Younis where bodies were laid out before they were to be carried by loved ones to burials. Reuters

Kant also said it was critical to understand that IMEC is a long-term initiative, along with being crucial to driving regional prosperity.

"The development of islands, ports, inland waterways and rail-based hubs will lead to a reduction in the cost of logistics. For instance, in the case of India, IMEC has the potential to reduce trade time with the EU, our second largest trading partner, by 40%," he said.

India's official push to green hydrogen - the hydrogen pipeline planned as part of IMEC - can significantly boost India's export potential in the field. "It will also be critical in developing a regional clean hydrogen economy," he said.

## Samsung Executive Chairman Pleads for Chance to Lead as Lawyers Seek Jail



**Seoul:** Samsung Electronics Co Executive Chairman Jay Y. Lee denied wrongdoing and pleaded for a chance to lead South Korea's biggest company after prosecutors requested he receive a five-year prison term for charges involving a controversial merger of two Samsung Group units in 2015.

In the hearing of the Seoul Central District Court on Friday, prosecutors also asked for Lee to be fined 500 million won (\$450,000). The court is scheduled to deliver its ruling on Jan. 26, ending a trial that has lasted more than three years.

In his final argument late Friday, Lee stressed his duty to steer the company his grandfather founded to the next stage at a time of heightened geopolitical risks, rapid supply chain reorganization and technological disruptions. He said his responsibilities include preparing for the future while competing and collaborating with global tech giants.

"I will give everything I have to fulfill these responsibilities," he said in an argument that lasted about 40 minutes. Bloomberg

## SpaceX Starship Rocket Lost in Second Test Flight

SpaceX launched its mega rocket Starship but lost both the booster and the spacecraft in a pair of explosions minutes into Saturday's test flight. The rocketship reached space following liftoff from South Texas, but communication suddenly was lost. SpaceX officials said it appears the ship's self-destruct system blew it up over the Gulf of Mexico. AP

## Russian Drone Attack Hits Ukraine Infra

**Kiev:** Russia carried out a major drone attack on Ukraine overnight, hitting infrastructure facilities and causing power outages in more than 400 towns and villages in the south, southeast, and north of the country, Ukrainian officials said on Saturday.

Ukrainian air defenses shot down 21 out of 36 Iranian-made Shahed drones launched from Russian territory, the air force said.

Last winter, Russia pounded Ukraine with hundreds of missiles and drones, leaving millions without electricity, heating, and wa-

ter during the coldest months.

This year Ukraine had an unusually warm autumn. But as temperatures start to fall, officials have urged residents and businesses to prepare for renewed Russian attacks. "We don't have a right to relax," Volodymyr Zelensky, head of the power grid operator Ukrenergo, told Ukrainian TV. "Certainly, all of us, energy workers and defence forces, are preparing to repel possible Russian attacks on the energy infrastructure this winter." Reuters

Such a move could compel hundreds of thousands of Palestinians who fled south from the Israeli assault on Gaza City to move again, along with residents of Khan Younis, a city of more than 400,000, setting off a dire humanitarian crisis.

"We're asking people to relocate if possible. It's not easy for many of them, but we don't want to see civilians caught up in the crossfire," Mark Regev, an aide to Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, told MSNBC on Friday.

Israel vowed to annihilate the Hamas militant group that controls the Gaza Strip after its Oct. 7 rampage into Israel in which its fighters killed 1,200 people and dragged 240 hostages into the enclave, according to officials.

Since then, Israel has bombed much of Gaza City, the enclave's urban core, to rubble, ordered the

Eyad Al-Zazo, said Reuters he told his aunt, her children and her grandchildren in the air strike in Khan Younis, and that all had evacuated from north Gaza at Israeli army orders only to die where the army told them they could be safe.

"All of them were martyred. They had nothing to do with the (Hamas) resistance," said Zazo, standing outside the morgue at Nasser Hospital in Khan Younis where 20 bodies were laid out before they were to be carried by loved ones to burials. Reuters

## US: Hamas Must Release Hostages to Get More Aid

Washington: Hamas must release more hostages in return for a significant increase in aid to Gaza and a pause in fighting, one of the US's top Middle East envoys said on Saturday.

"The surge in humanitarian relief, the surge in fuel, the pause in fighting will come when hostages are released," said Brett McGurk, who's Joe Biden's Coordinator for the Middle East and North Africa.

McGurk, speaking at the BSA Manama Dialogue, a regional security conference in Bahrain, said the US's approach has helped hostage negotiations to fail.

Hamas, which the US and European designate a terrorist organization, secured Israeli hostages on Oct. 7, killing 1,200 people and taking 249 back to Gaza as hostages. Israel responded with massive airstrikes and a ground offensive on the enclave, which the Hamas-run government says have killed more than 22,000 people. Bloomberg

Ukrainian air defenses shot down 20 out of 30 Iranian-made Shahed drones launched from Russian territory, the air force said.

Last winter, Russia pounded Ukraine with hundreds of missiles and drones, leaving millions without electricity, heating, and wa-

ter during the coldest months.

Gaza health authorities raised the death toll on Friday to more than 12,000, 1,000 of them children. The United Nations deems those figures credible, though they are now updated infrequently due to the difficulty of collecting information.

Overnight on Saturday 30 Palestinians were killed and 20 injured by an air strike on two apartments in a multi-story block in a busy resi-

dential district of Khan Younis, according to health officials.

Eyad Al-Zazo, said Reuters he told his aunt, her children and her grandchildren in the air strike in Khan Younis, and that all had evacuated from north Gaza at Israeli army orders only to die where the army told them they could be safe.

"All of them were martyred. They had nothing to do with the (Hamas) resistance," said Zazo, standing outside the morgue at Nasser Hospital in Khan Younis where 20 bodies were laid out before they were to be carried by loved ones to burials. Reuters

## US: Hamas Must Release Hostages to Get More Aid

Washington: Hamas must release more hostages in return for a significant increase in aid to Gaza and a pause in fighting, one of the US's top Middle East envoys said on Saturday.

"The surge in humanitarian relief, the surge in fuel, the pause in fighting will come when hostages are released," said Brett McGurk, who's Joe Biden's Coordinator for the Middle East and North Africa.

McGurk, speaking at the BSA Manama Dialogue, a regional security conference in Bahrain, said the US's approach has helped hostage negotiations to fail.

Hamas, which the US and European designate a terrorist organization, secured Israeli hostages on Oct. 7, killing 1,200 people and taking 240 back to Gaza as hostages. Israel responded with massive airstrikes and a ground offensive on the enclave, which the Hamas-run government says have killed more than 22,000 people. Bloomberg

## Samsung Executive Chairman Pleads for Chance to Lead as Lawyers Seek Jail

Seoul: Samsung Electronics Co. Executive Chairman Jay Y. Lee denied wrongdoing and pleaded for a chance to lead South Korea's biggest company after prosecutors requested he receive a five-year prison term for charges involving a controversial merger of two Samsung Group units in 2015.

In the hearing at the Seoul Central District Court on Friday, prosecutors also asked for Lee to be fined 500 million won (\$460,000). The court is scheduled to deliver its ruling on January 26, ending a trial that has lasted more than three years.

In his final argument late on Friday, Lee stressed his duty to steer the company his grandfather founded to the next stage at a time of heightened geopolitical risks, rapid supply-chain reorganization and technological disruptions. He said his responsibilities include preparing for the future while competing and collaborating with global tech giants.

"I will give everything I have to fulfill these responsibilities," he said in an argument that lasted almost 10 minutes. Bloomberg

SpaceX launched its mega rocket Starship but lost both the booster and the spacecraft in a pair of explosions minutes into Saturday's test flight. The rocketship reached space following liftoff from South Texas, but communication suddenly was lost. SpaceX officials said it appears the ship's self-destruct system blew it up over the Gulf of Mexico. AP

## Russian Drone Attack Hits Ukraine Infra

Kiev: Russia carried out a major drone attack on Ukraine overnight, hitting infrastructure facilities and causing power outages in more than 800 towns and villages in the south, southeast, and north of the country, Ukrainian officials said on Saturday.

Ukrainian air defenses shot down 20 out of 30 Iranian-made Shahed drones launched from Russian territory, the air force said.

Last winter, Russia pounded Ukraine with hundreds of missiles and drones, leaving millions without electricity, heating, and wa-

ter during the coldest months.

This year Ukraine had an unusually warm autumn. But as temperatures start to fall, officials have urged residents and businesses to prepare for renewed Russian attacks. "We don't have a right to relax," Volodymyr Kadrytskyi head of the power grid operator Ukrenergo, told Ukrainian TV. "Certainly all of us, energy workers and defence forces, are preparing to repel possible Russian attacks on the energy infrastructure this winter." Reuters

Executives at Microsoft, the largest investor in OpenAI, were taken aback by the surprise. Microsoft CEO Satya Nadella was "shocked" by the news and was furious, according to someone with direct knowledge of his thinking.

Altman is likely to start another company, one person said, and will work with former employees of OpenAI. There has been a wave of departures following Altman's firing, and there are likely to be more in the coming days, this person said.

In another post, Altman suggested he would have more to say about the company in the future. "If I start going off, the OpenAI board should go after me for the full value of my shares," Altman famously has said. He has zero equity in the startup.

## Elon Musk Says X to File 'Thermonuclear' Lawsuit Against Media Watchdog

Media watchdog Media Matters alleges ads were being placed alongside antisemitic content

New York: X Corp, formerly known as Twitter, will file a lawsuit against Media Matters and those who attacked social media platform X, Elon Musk said on Saturday in a post on the platform, soon after major US companies paused their advertisements on the site.

"The split second court opens on Monday X will be filing a thermonuclear lawsuit against Media Matters and all those who colluded in this fraudulent attack on our company," Musk wrote in a post on X, without naming any other parties.

Liberal media watching group Media Matters for America earlier this week said it found that corporate advertisements by IBM, Apple, Oracle and Comcast's Xfinity were being placed alongside antisemitic content.

X filed on Saturday said it immediately suspended all advertising on Musk-owned X after the watchdog found its ads were placed next to content praising Adolf Hitler and the Nazi Party.

Disney, Warner Bros. Discovery and Comcast, Lucasfilm Entertainment and Paramount Global said on Friday they were also pausing their ads on X. Axios reported that Apple would do the same.
